

Care & Cleaning

Cleaning the Moulds

1. Get an old toothbrush, a few paper towels, and a bowl of warm water mixed with a few drops of dishwashing liquid.



2. Wet the mould thoroughly and gently scrub the cavities with the toothbrush being sure to work out any remaining bits of dried plaster that have collected in the corners.



3. Rinse with cold, clean water and set aside on the paper towels to air-dry. Remove any stubborn bits of plaster with a toothpick, taking care not to damage the rubber mould.

Care and Storage

After cleaning your Linka moulds, dry them thoroughly before putting them away. Store them out of direct sunlight and in a climate-controlled environment (e.g., inside the home, not in the garage). Extremes of humidity can warp and damage your moulds, significantly shortening their useful lifespan.

Store your moulds flat. If possible, place a piece of tissue or waxed paper between each mould to prevent the moulds from sticking to each other during periods of high humidity (e.g., during the summer months).

Following these simple steps will ensure that your Linka moulds last for hundreds of castings and provide many years of enjoyment.
